Over 100 National Wildlife Refuges are served by the Portland, Oregon regional staff of the National Wildlife Refuge System (NWRS). These refuges are located in six western states -- in Idaho, Washington, Oregon, Nevada, California and Hawaii -- as well as Pacific Island territories. Refuges range in size from one million plus acres Desert National Wildlife Refuge to tiny Atolls in the Pacific Ocean. They encompass wetlands, estuaries, grasslands, rain forest, to deserts and all of the variations in between. Endangered species are a focus on some refuges. Many refuges serve birds migrating from or to other countries
